

## SELECTIONS: 6-1-12

HENRY HALL is a grand old campaigner who, judging by recent efforts, has a little race like this still within his capabilities. **JOHN KEATS** ran by far his best of the year when second at Haydock last time. Off a lenient handicap mark at present he should take this if able to overcome his unfavorable draw. VIEWFORTH shaped better last time albeit in a claiming race and should give a good account from a handy draw while MAJESTICAL is another to consider to include in exotic wagers.



**PONTEFRACT** a left-handed undulating oval, approximately two miles around. Not an ideal course for long striding horses, although plenty of stamina is needed to cope with the uphill climb over the final three furlongs. Horses drawn low have a slight advantage in sprints. Despite the stiff finish, runners that establish a clear lead into the final furlong often hold off the closers, particularly on good to firm and faster going.
